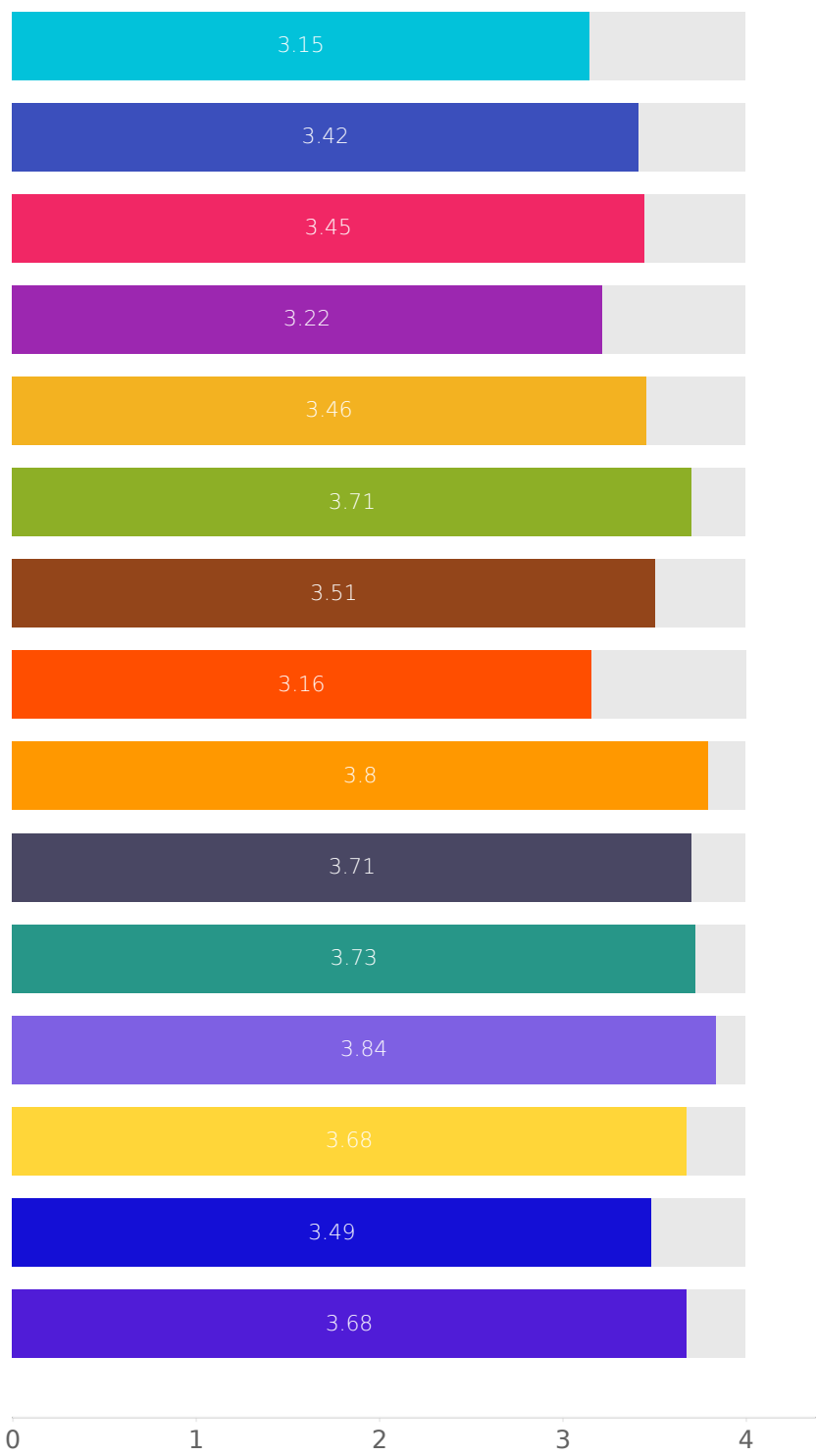

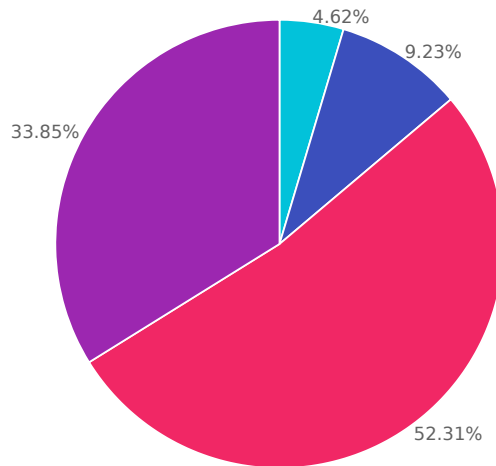

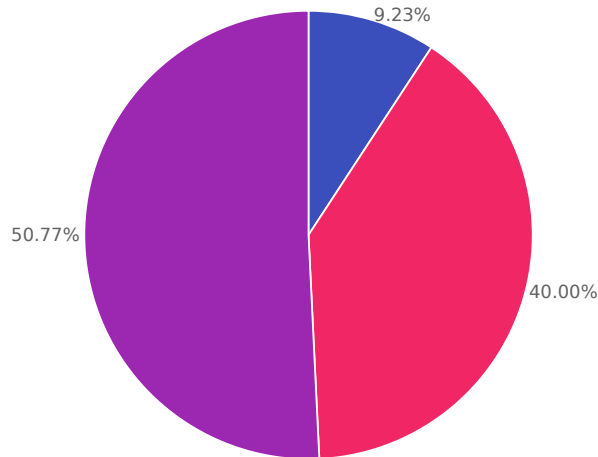

This is due to the workflow in the admission process. It is difficult to say everything is on eFundi - when non-registered students cannot access and the system will be offline for a week.

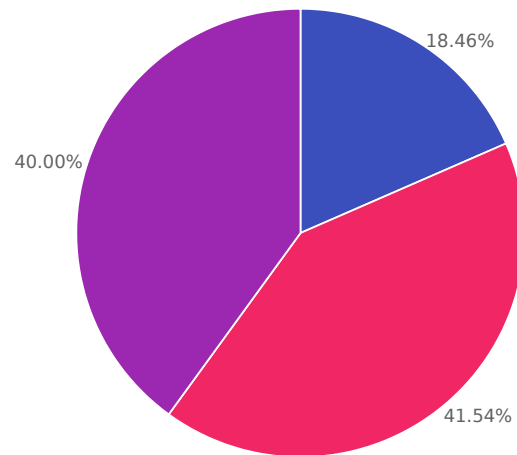
